Admiral James B. Osborn Memorial Scholarship Program

The Charleston Base Scholarship program reached a new plateau in January by accumulating over \$10,000 through donations, rummage sales and raffles for the future scholars in the Charleston Tri-county area. The scholarship program is named in honor of Admiral James B. Osborn who commanded the Navy's first Ballistic Missile Submarine, the USS George Washington (SSBN-598) in 1958.

This remarkable achievement of the scholarship program was highlighted through the generosity of Lifetime Base member John Lookabill, RMCM(SS), USN, Retired. John is the

- Submarine Museum – Dave Harvey
 - o Dave Harvey presented a proposal that has been sent to North Charleston Mayor Summey, TV Channel 5, Post & Courier, American Submariner, and others.
 - o They are waiting on a response from USSVI National, but the proposal is to build a facility on the Old Naval Base to include:
 - § Museum – initial items supplied by The After Battery
 - § Restaurant – a “for profit” location
 - o Dave outlined the expected profits and dispersal. The details are in the letter, of which Dave had copies for those interested in more information.
 - o The submarine museum proposal will not cost Charleston Base a single dollar.
 - o Nick will post the proposal on the Base website.
 - o For those who were at the BOD Meeting last week, Dave had provided the preliminary letter for review. It has since been revised.

- The Minutes from the November Base Meeting and the Christmas Party have been emailed directly to the Base membership, published in the Base Newsletter and have been promulgated on the Base Website. There were no changes. The Base Meeting Minutes were approved as presented.

Chaplain – Nick Nichols:

- Highlighted boat of the month:
 - o USS SWORDFISH SS-193 was lost on January 12, 1945 with the loss of 89 officers and

men somewhere near Okinawa on her 13th war patrol. After repeated attempts to contact Swordfish by radio had failed, she was reported as lost; the victim of unknown causes but best guess is a mine.

- There are several shipmates and family members who have given me information which they wish to be kept confidential at this time.
- At the Christmas party we tolled the bell for 21 of our shipmates. Their names are in the Christmas Party Base minutes posted on the website. The following three departed after the November meeting.

· **ET1(SS) Jimmy L. Kimbrell**, USN Ret., 84, departed on Eternal Patrol on Nov. 30, 2022 at his home in James Island. Jimmy joined the Navy in 1957 and retired in 1976. He was a member of USSVI & Charleston Base [2011], a member of the Holland Club, a member of FRA Branch 269, a member of VFW Post 3142 and a member of American Legion Post 112. Jimmy qualified on USS TIRANTE SS-520 in 1959. He also served on USS EARL B. HALL APD 107, USS ODAX SS-484, USS ETHAN ALLEN SSBN608, USS WOODROW WILSON SSBN-624, USS SIMON BOLIVAR SSBN-641 and FBMSTC CHARLESTON SC twice. There was no service and no obituary. Ray Kimbrell, Jimmy's son, emailed saying they plan on having his ashes sent to sea per his wishes as he so loved his fellow sailors and his sea service.

· **RMC(SS) Gordon A. Smith**, USN Ret., 78, departed on Eternal Patrol at his home in Cottageville on December 13, 2022. Gordon joined the Navy in 1963 and retired in 1983. He was a Life Member of USSVI & Charleston Base [2010], a member of the Holland Club, and a member of FRA Branch 269. Gordon qualified on USS LEWIS and CLARK SSBN644 in 1967. He also served on GRAYLING SSN646 and L. MENDEL RIVERS SSN686. In accordance with his wishes there was not a funeral or memorial service.

· **LCDR(SS) George William Barnette III**, USN Ret., 87, departed on Eternal Patrol at his home on December 13, 2022. George joined the Navy

in 1953 and retired in 1978 after a 25-year career. He was a Life Member of USSVI & Charleston Base [1999] and a member of the Holland Club. He qualified on USS CHIVO SS-341 in 1962. He also served on SARDA SS-488, STERLET SS-392 and TUNNEY SS/SSG/APSS/LPSS-282 as Executive Officer. His funeral service was held in the Summerall Chapel at the Citadel on Thursday, Jan 5th. Charleston Base SUBVETS did not participate. Condolences on behalf of Charleston Base was placed on the funeral home website.

- **Ruth Petersen**, Don's wife, passed away on 31 Dec. Arrangements are being made. Don says many members will know her as the bartender at the Chiefs Club on the base. Memorial services are being planned.
