Five Boats and 262 Men Lost

USS Grayling (SS-209)

The fourth Grayling (SS-209) was laid down on 15 December 1939 Her second patrol, beginning 27 March, was more successful. Cruising off the coast of Japan itself, Grayling sank her first ship 13 April, sending the cargo freighter Ryujin Maru to the bottom. She returned to Hawaii 16 May.

Changing her base of operations to Australia, Grayling stood out of Fremantle 7 January 1943 on her fifth patrol, this time in Philippine waters. She sank cargo ship Ushio Maru west of Luzon 26 January and damaged another Japanese ship the next day.

Grayling left Australian waters 18 March on her sixth war patrol and cruised in the Tarakan area and the Verde Island Passage. There she attacked and sunk cargo ship Shanghai Maru 9 April and damaged four other ships before returning to Fremantle 25 April.

Grayling began her eighth and last war patrol in July from Fremantle. She made two visits to the coast of the Philippines delivering supplies and equipment to guerrillas at Pucio Point, Pandan Bay, Panay, 31 July and 23 August 1943. Cruising in the Philippines area, Grayling recorded her last kill, the passenger-cargo Meizan Maru 27 August in the Tablas Strait, but was not heard from again after 9 September. Grayling was officially reported "lost with all hands" 30 September 1943, after having recorded five major kills totalling 20,575 tons. All but the first of Grayling's eight war patrols were declared "successful."


Grayling received six battle stars for World War II service.

IMPORTANT DATES

VICTORY OVER JAPAN DAY (V-J DAY) September 2, 1945

Victory over Japan Day (V-J Day) would officially be celebrated in the United States on the day formal surrender documents were signed aboard the USS Missouri in Tokyo Bay: September 2, 1945. But as welcome as victory over Japan was, the day was bittersweet in light of the war's destructiveness.









IMPORTANT DATES

PATRIOT DAY **September 11, 2001**

Patriot Day on September 11th honors the memory of the nearly 3,000 innocent victims who died in the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks. Each year Americans dedicate this day to remembering those who died and the first responders who risked their own lives to save others.

WE REMEMBER

For many, September 11, 2001, began like any other weekday. We made our way to work. Children attended school. We shopped, had coffee, waited in line at a drive-thru. Those of us who weren't in New York City heard the first reports on the radio or television. A friend or neighbor alerted us to a plane flying into one of the Twin Towers. We felt disbelief. An accident, perhaps, a miscalculation. Then, a second plane flew into the second tower. Our disbelief turned into uncertainty and concern.

- 8:46 AM EDT American Airlines Flight #11 collides into the World Trade Center
- 9:03 AM EDT United Airlines Flight #175 collides into the World Trade **Center South Tower**
- 9:37 AM EDT American Airlines Flight #77 crashes into the Pentagon
- 9:59 AM EDT World Trade Center South Tower Collapses
- 10:03 AM EDT United Airlines Flight #93 crashes in Shanksville, PA 10:28 AM EDT - World Trade Center North Tower Collapses



IMPORTANT DATES

POW/MIA RECOGNITION DAY (third Friday in September) 19 September 2025

National POW/MIA Recognition Day — which this year falls on Sept. 17 — was established in 1979 through a proclamation signed by President Jimmy Carter a President who earned his dolphins.

The proclamation reads, in part: "In each of America's wars, our prisoners of war have been called upon to make uncommon sacrifices. Upon them has fallen the arduous responsibility of defending American ideals under the absolute control of the enemy.

According to the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, there are about 81,600 Americans missing — from the battlefields of World War II to recent conflicts. About 75% of those are in the Indo-Pacific region. About 41,000 of the 81,600 missing are presumed lost at sea.

As for POWs, the Congressional Research Service reports:

- There are 130,201 World War II POWs; of those, 14,072 died.
- There are —7,140 Korean War POWs; of those, 2,701 died.
- There are —725 Vietnam War POWs; of those, 64 died.
- There have been 37 POWs since the Vietnam War; no one is still in captivity.



Manitowoc Report – Dave Harvey

- Base Commander Dave Harvey reported on the trip to Manitowoc having those in the room who attended the event to stand. Herb Anderson who had ridden his motorcycle on the 1,000 mile trip was not present. (Probably not back yet.)
- The Charleston Base Float had been transported by truck to the event and was the first submarine float in the parade for over nine years. We felt welcome everywhere we went.
- We were interviewed by both radio and TV reporters. There is an article in the newspaper as well. This will be put into the Charleston Base Newsletter.

 The Minutes from the June Base Meeting were emailed to all Base members. The Minutes have been published on the Base Website for download. The Minutes were approved as written.

Chaplain - Nick Nichols:

- Highlighted boat of the month:
 - S-28 (SS 133) was lost on July 4, 1944 with the loss of 49 crew members. She was conducting training exercises off Hawaii with the US Coast Guard Cutter Reliance. After S-28 dove for a practice torpedo approach, Reliance lost contact. No distress signal or explosion was heard. Two days later, an oil slick was found near where S-28 had dove. The exact cause of her loss remains a mystery.

There are several shipmates and family members who have given me information which they wish to be kept confidential at this time.

All of the shipmates on this binnacle list would really appreciate a phone call or even a card from their shipmates in the base. Contact information can be found on the Sailing List.

- FTCS(SS) Albert 'Al' Stoll, 80, departed on Eternal Patrol at the Victory House in Walterboro on 5 July 2025. Al joined the Navy in 1962 and retired in 1983. He was a Member of USSVI National [2002] and Charleston Base [2002]. He was a member of the Holland Club qualifying in 1969 on USS THREADFIN SS-410. Al also served on USS AMBERJACK SS-522, USS TRUMPETFISH SS-425 and USS PARCHE SSN-683. He served on two tenders USS HOWARD W. GILMORE AS-16 and USS BUSHNELL AS-15. His shore assignments were Submarine School NLON (twice) and Submarine Group SIX. Al was also a member of the Fleet Reserve Association Branch 269, Navy League US and Rotary.
