USS Wahoo (SS-238) Lieutenant Commander Dudley W. "Mush" Morton Lost 11 October 19

Wahoo's fifth war patrol was hailed as outstanding in aggressiveness and efficiency. In just 10 days, Wahoo launched 10 torpedo attacks on eight different targets. Wahoo sank a total of 93,281 tons of shipping and damaged 30,880 more in only 25 days of the patrol. The patrol was Morton's third as commander of the boat establishing a record not only in damage inflicted on the enemy for three successive patrols, but also for accomplishing this feat in the shortest time. Morton received a gold star, in lieu of a second Navy Cross, from Commander in Chief of the Pacific Fleet Admiral Chester W. Nimitz.

After intensive post-repair trials and training, Wahoo departed on her sixth war patrol. The patrol's beginnings were marked by the worst possible luck with torpedoes. Within four days, 12 Japanese vessels were sighted and nine were hunted down and attacked to no avail. The torpedoes either broached, made erratic runs, or were just duds. Morton reported their poor performance and was ordered to return to base.

USS Wahoo (SS-238) Lieutenant Commander Dudley W. "Mush" Morton Lost 11 October 19

Morton was profoundly upset about the last patrol. He requested return to the Sea of Japan, and it was granted. On 9 September, Wahoo was underway from Pearl Harbor to La Perouse Strait. Once the legendary boat reached its destination, the plan was for Wahoo to enter the Sea of Japan first accompanied by USS Sawfish (SS-276). On 21 October, Wahoo was to head for home, but nothing was ever heard from Morton or Wahoo again. According to Japanese military records, Morton sank four ships amounting to about 13,000 tons on their final patrol. Japanese records also reported on 11 October that an antisubmarine aircraft discovered a surfaced submarine where Wahoo was estimated to be located and attacked, dropping three depth charges.

The loss of Morton sent shock waves among the submarine force and triggered a change tactics in the Sea of Japan. It would not be until June 1945 when submarines would return and that was with special mine detecting equipment. In postwar accounting, "Mush" Morton sank 19 ships for approximately 55,000 tons of enemy shipping. In terms of individual ships sunk, he was one of the top three skippers of the war. Morton received another Navy Cross posthumously. Wahoo earned six battle stars for her World War II service.

US Navy Birthday 13 October 250 Years!

A 13 October 1775 resolution of the Continental Congress established what is now the United States Navy with "a swift sailing vessel, to carry ten carriage guns, and a proportionable number of swivels, with eighty men, be fitted, with all possible despatch, for a cruise of three months...." After the American War of Independence, the U.S. Constitution empowered the new Congress "to provide and maintain a navy." Acting on this authority, Congress established the Department of the Navy on 30 April 1798.



IMPORTANT DATES

Day Of The Deployed 26 October

Day of the Deployed is a day to honor our deployed troops and their families for their bravery and the sacrifices they are making for our country. Supporters of the military are urged to get personally involved in activities that send care packages, offer messages of encouragement, and other morale-boosting activities to those currently deployed overseas and the military families of the deployed.

Over the years, John Hoeven moved on from being a governor to a career as a North Dakota State Senator, and in 2011 he led an effort to establish official recognition for the holiday. On Oct. 18, 2011, his resolution passed unanimously for the first Day Of The Deployed. The Senate resolution is passed anew each year.

In a press release issued by the Senator's office that first announced the measure, Hoeven said, "Our U.S. service men and women currently deployed, along with their loved ones, make untold sacrifices as they serve our nation...A national Day of the Deployed pays tribute to their commitment to our country and their work to protect our freedoms."



IMPORTANT DATES

Navy Day 27 October

What is the difference between Navy Day and the Navy Birthday? Both occur in the month of October, and both celebrate the men and women of the United States Navy, past and present. The Navy celebrates its birthday officially on Oct. 13, and Navy Day was established to be observed on Oct. 27.

This year Navy Day will be on Monday, Oct. 27, 2025.


There are plenty of differences between the two, starting with the fact that the Navy Birthday is recognized on the anniversary of the historical formation of the Continental Navy during the American Revolution. Navy Day was originally chosen to coincide with the birthday of President Theodore Roosevelt.

Navy Day is actually the older observance, in terms of when it was created and officially recognized as it is today. The "official" observation of the Navy birthday was initiated by Admiral Elmo Zumwalt in 1972, but Navy Day was sponsored by the Navy League of New York in 1922.

While both holidays recognize the service and sacrifices of those in uniform, Navy Day is specifically about military service, where the Navy birthday celebrates the origins and history of the U.S. Navy.

Navy Day isn't unique to the American military. Many countries worldwide celebrate their own versions on different dates and with different traditions. Russia, Turkey, Pakistan, the United Kingdom, India, Croatia, Mexico, and many other nations all hold their own observations.

While in Branson with Wendy and US Air Force friends, we were honored to visit this veterans museum. It is not the largest nor the most extravagant veterans museum I have visited but well worth the visit. It's basically a circular museum that starts with WWI memorabilia through more current wars and takes 1—2 hours to complete.

This was the first veterans museum where I saw a list of all ~417,000 Americans who died in action during WWII.



Charleston Base and Members Win Awards at the National Convention


As Special Events Coordinator, I am pleased to inform you that we were all big winners at the 2025 USSVI National Convention this past week.



USS Holland (SS-1) Commissioned 12 October 1900

John Philip Holland, the man who developed the first true submarine accepted by U.S. Navy (spending 57 of his 74 years working with submersibles), was born in Liscannor, County Clare, Ireland, on 29 February 1840. As a youth, he considered the use of the submarine to further the cause of Irish Independence. Holland came to the United States in 1873. In 1875 his first submarine designs were submitted for consideration by the U.S. Navy, but turned down as unworkable.

On 16 October 1900, Holland left Newport under tow of the tug Leyden for Annapolis where she trained cadets of the Naval Academy as well as officers and enlisted men ordered there to receive training so vital in preparing for the operation of other submarines being built for the Fleet.

Historic WWII submarine USS Cobia begins journey for maintenance in Sturgeon Bay 7 September 2025

MANITOWOC, Wis. (WLUK) -- A historic submarine is ready for some muchneeded maintenance in Sturgeon Bay.

The USS Cobia left its dock at the Wisconsin Maritime Museum in Manitowoc on Sunday morning.

It was originally scheduled to move on Thursday, but was rescheduled due to weather delays.

The WWII-era submarine will be towed 55 nautical miles north to Fincantieri Bay Shipbuilding in Sturgeon Bay.

There it will be cleaned, inspected, replated, and repainted in dry dock.

- 67 years ago August 12, 1958 USS Nautilus completes first undersea voyage to North Pole
- 25 years ago August 12, 2000 Soviet Submarine KURSK sank in Barents Sea loss of all hands
