USS Sculpin (SS-191) CAPT Cromwell was posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor

Sculpin departed on her ninth war patrol in the waters north of Truk, where she was to intercept and attack Japanese ships departing for the upcoming invasion of Tarawa in the Gilbert Islands. Sculpin and two other submarines were to form "wolfpacks" in an effort to conduct coordinated attacks on the Japanese. Captain John P. Cromwell was onboard Sculpin to coordinate the attacks. After refueling at Johnston Island, Cromwell was ordered to commence the attacks on 29 November. After the submarine failed to acknowledge receipt of the orders, the message was repeated 48 hours later. The submarine was presumed lost about a month later.

Sculpin's final story was told by surviving crewmembers, who were liberated from Japanese prisoner of war camps at wars end. On 16 November, Sculpin arrived in the patrol area, and two days later, made radar contact with a large, high-speed enemy convoy. The following morning, Sculpin surfaced to attack, but after detection, the enemy started to zigzag towards her making it difficult to score a hit. The Japanese convoy then changed course. Sculpin dove and then resurfaced to attempt another attack. When the boat surfaced, a rear guard destroyer was discovered only 600 yards away. Sculpin crash-dived surviving the first salvo of depth charges. A second wave of attacks caused only minor damage to the submarine.

After evading the enemy destroyer in a rainsquall, Sculpin attempted to come to periscope depth, but the depth gauge was damaged—stuck at 125 feet. Sculpin was detected by enemy sonar and she dove. The enemy rained 18 depth charges on Sculpin causing significant damage. Massive amounts of water began to enter the submarine making her an easy target for the Japanese. Another depth charge attack knocked out Sculpin's sonar, leaving her running blind.

After realizing the submarine was dead in the water, Commander Fred Connaway ordered the doomed boat to surface to give the crew a chance to escape. Sculpin's gunners manned the deck, but they were no match for the enemy destroyer's main battery. A shell hit the conning tower killing the bridge watch team, the gun crew, and the submarine's commander. The ship's senior surviving officer, Cromwell, ordered the submarine to be scuttled. Cromwell, who possessed vital information on the upcoming assault on the Gilbert Islands and other important future operations, feared he might reveal the plans if he was captured. The Japanese were infamous for their barbaric techniques in extracting information, which included torture and the use of drugs. Cromwell refused to be captured or abandon the submarine. He went down with the submarine, giving his life valiantly for his country. Cromwell received the Medal of Honor posthumously for extraordinary heroism.

Destroyer Yamagumo retrieved more than 40 of Sculpin's crew. After ten days of torture and questioning at a Japanese naval base at Truk, the prisoners of war were loaded on two aircraft carriers headed for Japanese prison camps. Escort carrier Chuyo carried half of the POWs. On 2 December, USS Sailfish (SS-192) torpedoed and sank Chuyo. The attack killed all but one of the American prisoners onboard. The remainder of Sculpin's survivors, who were on a separate aircraft carrier, made it safely to Japan and worked in copper mines for the duration of the war. Ironically, Sailfish was previously named Squalus. It was the submarine Sculpin helped rescue back in 1939 off the Isle of Shoals.

Sculpin received eight battle stars for her war service and the Philippine Presidential Unit Citation.



Legacy ID Cards No Longer Valid in 2026!

Two Month Reminder

Military retirees are required to update their Uniformed Services Identification (USID) cards to the new Next Generation USID card by December 31, 2025. The paper-based USID cards with indefinite expiration dates will no longer be accepted after this date. The new cards are more secure and durable, incorporating features like plastic cardstock and enhanced security measures. According to the DoD Common Access Card website, USID cards are issued to retired military and Reserve members, dependent family members of uniformed Service members, and other eligible individuals in accordance with DoD policy. It's important for military retirees/dependents/surviving spouses to know these old forms of ID will not be valid to access a military installation, and you will need issuance of the NextGen ID card.

This will be true even if your old ID card has an INDEF expiration date on it - the ID will still be invalid.

The deadline is 31 December 2025. Based on this, we strongly encourage everyone with an old-style ID card to get a NextGen ID card now!

U.S. Navy submariner joins mission to rebuild an Anglo-Saxon king's 1,400-year-old longship

Woodbridge, England — In a far-flung corner of southeast England, in a boatshed on the River Debden, a former U.S. Navy submariner whose career saw him serve on some of the most advanced nuclear-powered vessels of the 20th century has embarked on a mission into the past. David "Mac" MacDonald is one of 180 volunteers building a precise replica of a ship that set sail under the command of a king almost one-and-a-half millennia ago.

They're working with The Sutton Hoo Ship's Company in the small town of Woodbridge, and their mission is to build a historically accurate reproduction of the wooden longship famously discovered on the site, which is believed to have been the final resting place of a 7th-century Anglo-Saxon king.

MacDonald grew up in New England and then lived in North Carolina for 30 years, but he moved to the U.K. seven years ago.

He built bespoke furniture and is a trained violin maker, but he put all that aside for a set of Anglo-Saxon axes after one of his wife's friends mentioned the project. Now he's part of the longship family, where he says he has "been made most welcome."

The Secret Submarine with Tiny Little Ski Legs

Nearly 400 feet beneath the freezing Sea of Okhotsk in the far east Soviet territorial waters, two divers clung to their lives through the umbilical cords that pumped warm water into their diving suits. 

- ---60 police officers went to sleep in preparation for their morning patrol.
- ---8 paramedics went to sleep in preparation for their morning shift of saving lives.

None of them saw past 10 a.m. September 11, 2001. None.

Tonight, as you go to sleep in preparation for your life tomorrow, kiss the ones you love. Hug your spouse and snuggle a little tighter, and **never take one second of your life for granted**. Never.

New Business:

- New Trailer for Float Dave Harvey Float Coordinator
 - After turning over control of the Base Meeting to Vice Commander Tom Lawson, Dave Harvey as Float Coordinator explained that he recently was able to acquire a 22 foot 15,000 pound capacity, heavy duty trailer which has regular tires and electric brakes.
 - A conservative estimate to fix the old trailer with correct axles, tires and brakes would be upwards of \$4,500. After hearing that the planned use was by SubVets, the man who sold the trailer to Dave agreed to an \$800 reduction in price, making the cost for this new trailer \$2,000.

This boat's last recorded ship sunk happened on Sept 25th, so she probably hit a mine on or after that date but before Oct 5th, when she was scheduled back at Midway.
