I am starting a new feature in 2026 to acknowledge the contribution made by the submarine force in WWII. They held the line against the Japanese until our fleet could be rebuilt after the attack on Pearl Harbor December 7, 1941.

I will start with the 23rd through the 25th, three this month, most successful submarines and highlight two more each month throughout the year.

Submarine Warfare Played Major Role in World War II Victory

In all, U.S. submarines destroyed 1,314 enemy warships in the Pacific, representing 55% of all Axis power warships lost and a total of 5.3 million tons of shipping

Out of 16,000 U.S. submariners, the force lost 375 officers and 3,131 enlisted men in 52 submarines, and "although this was a tragic loss, it was still the lowest casualty rate of any combatant submarine service on either side in the 1939-1945 conflict," Weir noted. In the final months of the war, American submarines had difficulty finding targets because the Japanese had virtually no ships left to sink.

During World War II, U.S. submarines sank more Japanese ships than did U.S. surface vessels and planes, but at a high cost: a twenty percent casualty rate


25. USS Archerfish (SS-211)

59,800 tons

USS Archerfish was a Balao-class submarine. She was the first ship of the United States Navy to be named for the archerfish. Archerfish is best known for sinking the Japanese aircraft carrier Shinano in November 1944, the largest warship ever sunk by a submarine. For this achievement, she received a Presidential Unit Citation after World War II.

- Commissioned 4 September 1943
- First war patrol 23 December 1943
- Fifth war patrol, December 1944, sunk Japanese Carrier Shinano, receiving the Presidential Unit Citation for this action
- Archerfish had 7 war patrols and survived the war
- Decommissioned 12 June 1946
- Archerfish received seven battle stars and one Presidential Unit Citation for her World War II service.
- Recommissioned 7 January 1952 during the Korean War
- Archer fish was decommissioned three times, last on 1 May 1968

24. USS Sunfish (SS-281) 59,815 tons

USS Sunfish was a Gato-class submarine, was the first ship of the United States Navy to be named for the ocean sunfish, Mola mola, a plectognath marine fish, having a deep body truncated behind, and high dorsal and anal fins.

- Commissioned 15 July 1942
- First war patrol 23 November 1942
- Second war patrol sunk her firsts ship the 3262 ton Kosei Maru 13 March
 1943
- Sunfish 11 war patrols and survived the war
- Decommissioned 26 December 1945
- Sunfish received nine battle stars for her WWII service

23. USS Wahoo (SS-238) 60,038 Tons

USS Wahoo (SS-238) was a Gato-class submarine, the first United States Navy ship to be named for the wahoo. Construction started before the U.S. entered World War II, and she was commissioned after entry. Wahoo was assigned to the Pacific theatre. She gained fame as an aggressive and highly successful submarine after Lieutenant Commander Dudley Walker "Mush" Morton became her skipper. She was sunk by Japanese aircraft in October 1943 while returning home from a patrol in the Sea of Japan.

- Commissioned 15 May 1942
- First war patrol 23 August 1942
- 31 December, Lieutenant Commander Dudley W. "Mush" Morton took command of Wahoo
- Fourth war patrol sunk 6 enemy vessels
- On 21 October, Wahoo was to head for home, but nothing was ever heard from Morton or Wahoo again
- "Mush" Morton sank 19 ships
- Wahoo earned six battle stars for World War II service


